Uniform Policy

Introduction

The Cambooya State School Student Uniform Policy reflects the school community standards and all students are expected to wear the approved uniform with pride. The uniform promotes a sense of belonging and fosters mutual respect among individuals at the school by minimising visible evidence of economic, class or social differences. As well as conforming to current sun safety requirements, our uniform offers protection to our students by making them easily identifiable as Cambooya students.

Cambooya State School Uniforms are available from the tuckshop on Thursday's between 8:30 and 9:30am during term time.

Boys Uniform

- Shorts** Long line maroon stubbies.
- Shirts** Maroon and gold polo shirt and school badge embroidered on the front. Year 6 have a leader's shirt that they may wear during the year.
- Socks** White socks with white shoes
Black socks with black shoes
- Hats** Maroon wide brimmed hat or a bucket hat.
- Sweatshirts** Maroon sweatshirt with the school badge screen printed on the front or spray jacket, maroon with a school badge.
- Shoes** Black leather shoes or predominately black or white Lace up/Velcro sports shoes (no patterned or neon coloured)
Children who can't tie laces should wear Velcro shoes
In winter maroon jackets and track pants may be worn.

Girls Uniform

Shorts/Skorts	Maroon skort or shorts
Shirts	Maroon and gold polo shirt and school badge embroidered on the front. Year 6 have a leaders shirt that they may wear during the year.
Socks	White socks with white shoes Black socks with black shoes
Hats	Maroon wide brimmed hat or a bucket hat.
Sweatshirts	Maroon sweatshirt with the school badge screen printed on the front or spray jacket, maroon with a school badge.
Shoes	Black leather shoes or predominately black or white Lace up/Velcro sports shoes (no patterned or neon coloured) <i>Children who can't tie laces should wear Velcro shoes</i> <i>In winter maroon jackets and track pants may be worn.</i>

Other Information

Jewellery

As jewellery can be dangerous to students involved in physical activities, minimal jewellery is to be worn to school. A wrist watch and small stud or sleeper earrings are acceptable. No other jewellery should be worn with the exception of a Medic Alert bracelet.

Hair

Hair that is shoulder length or longer must be tied back. Hair dye is permitted only in cases where the dye is a natural colour close to the shade of the student's actual hair colour. Hair should be cut and styled appropriately with no extreme styles. Eg Mohawk, blade zero all over. If students or parents have questions about a hair style they should discuss it with the Principal first. Coloured hair is not permitted, even on Sports Day.

Body Art

Coloured nail polish, nail art, make-up and fake tattoos are not permitted.
